

SPOTLIGHT ON IRELAND

Just the name "Ireland" conjures up images of a land shrouded in myth and legend, steeped in tradition, and awash with beautiful scenery. The Ireland in the mind's eye of many visitors is in its green countryside where - yes - you really will find charming villages with pubs playing classic Irish music and dreamy castles high on a hill. As connected as the island is to its past, it has contributed so much to the modern world through literature, art, and music. And all of it is characterized by an indomitable pride linked to a history of Irish struggle and a spirit that continues to this day.

Although a small, trade-dependent economy, Ireland is modern and full of momentum. At the heart of Brexit negotiations, Ireland has seen an increase in imports, with the surplus expected to continue through 2018. Due to the flux surrounding Brexit, however, domestic demand will continue to be the main driving force for the economy, as growth surrounding multinational firms remains uncertain. In addition, Ireland remains a very start-up friendly environment, with great corporate tax incentives and low bureaucracy levels. Ireland is expected to see wage growth and an increase in household consumption, paired with low inflation rates. Despite the manufacturing sector seeing a slowdown in recent years, the strength of the information technology and communication sectors will offset manufacturing's weak performance.

TOPICS TO EXPLORE

LITERATURE – From James Joyce and Oscar Wilde to William Butler Yeats and Samuel Beckett, this small country packs a literary punch. Much of it is deeply connected to Irish history and Irish identity, with works inspired by Gaelic tradition, the struggle for independence, the city of Dublin, and the countryside.

CORPORATE HO – Already home to major corporations like Pfizer and the Euro headquarters of Google and Twitter, Dublin has become an attractive destination for corporations. A low tax rate has been central to encouraging investment.

BEVERAGES – Ireland is home to world-famous breweries such as Guinness and numerous spirits and whiskey makers. See how this crowded sector contributes two billion Euros to the economy each year while boosting exports and supporting jobs in agriculture, distilling, and brewing

Welcome to Dublin! The Irish capital seduces its visitors with charms that are both sophisticated and gritty. All at once, it's a world financial center, the home to an unrivaled literary legacy, and, yes, the cobbled-stoned, pub-laden stereotype you've heard it can be. Drink in the city (pun intended), in all of its forms.

- Transportation from the airport to the hotel will be arranged based on the most common arrival time of all students (Please arrive prior to 11:30 am to be included in the group transfer).
- Meet your WorldStrides local staff and depart to the hotel via private coach.
- Drop off luggage to be stored securely at the hotel (check in time is at 3:00 pm)
- Meet your WorldStrides local staff in the hotel lobby and walk to classroom for your WorldStides Health & Safety Orientation.

WorldStrides Health & Safety Orientation

Familiarize yourself with the dos and don'ts of Vienna and learn about your surrounding area during a brief site-specific orientation led by your WorldStrides local staff - 2 hours of hotel meeting space included, 1-day and 7-day Leap Visitor card, and Heritage Card included.

Continue to afternoon walking tour via foot with stop en-route for lunch on own.

Dublin Historical Walking Tour

In just over 2 hours, this walking tour explores the main features of Irish history - Dublin's development, the influence of the American and French Revolutions, the Potato Famine, the Great War and the 1916 Rising, the War of Independence, the Northern conflict and Ireland Today – *guided, no entrances included.*

Following the walking tour, continue to Welcome Dinner.

Following class, meet your WorldStrides local staff and walk to Trinity College

Trinity College & Book of Kells

Lasting 35 minutes, the tour encompasses the four major squares of the College. It provides visitors with an insight into the more than four-hundred-year history of the College, its buildings and their use, its traditions and its life today. All of the guides are knowledgeable and enthusiastic students of Trinity College Dublin.

Explore the Book of Kells, an ancient manuscript famous the world over for its beautiful depiction of the four Gospels. Visit the beautiful and photo-worthy Long Library and learn about other similar manuscripts – *guided*, *entrance included*.

- After your Trinity College Tour, enjoy some free time for lunch on own.
- Following lunch, reconvene as a group and walk to Dublin Castle.

Dublin Castle

Visit Dublin Castle, which served as a residential site for the Viceroy of Ireland (the Irish representative to the British monarch) for over seven hundred years and as the inauguration site of Ireland's presidents since 1938 – self-guided, entrance included with Heritage Card.

- Return to hotel on foot.
- Free evening with dinner on own.

June 7 | Day Trip to Howth

- Meet your WorldStrides local staff and depart for the train station via public transportation
- Take a train from Dublin to Howth approx. 20 minutes. train tickets included.

Howth Guided Harbour & Village Tour

The Howth tour that connects you with the land, sea and the sky of the UNESCO Dublin Biosphere. Dive into the nature and history of Ireland on our award winning Howth tour around Howth head. Tune your senses and spirit to the ancient druids of Howth. Feel and sense the romance at Aideen's Grave, a druidic altar as old as the pyramids. Hike to HG Wells' most beautiful view in the world. Follow WB Yeats' Fairy Road down to the sea and the cliffs. Surrender to the whispers of the woodland and stories of the trees. Take steps into the myths and legends of 10,000 years. — *guided*, *no entrances required*.
