PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

This study abroad program is unequivocally a once in a lifetime experience - Athens, Greece - a city that is 3,400 years old. Athens is one of the oldest cities in the world and Europe's oldest capitol. Athens is also the birthplace of democracy, arts, science, and philosophy in western civilization. Athens is the home of classic philosophers - Socrates, Plato, and Aristotle, the prominent statesmen, orator, and general - Pericles, and the great Greek tragedians - Euripides, Sophocles, and Aeschylus. These Athenians commonly contemplated the origins of "mental processes" and "behaviors" - the contemporary definition of psychology and were considered "lovers of wisdom" - the original meaning of philosophy. The foundation of knowledge and learning was established by these figures and their followers during the "Golden Age of Athens" - 5th Century BC. Greek mythology established in literature and concerned with gods and heroes and their influence on the natural world remains a topic of interest to many today. Examine and explore how the concepts and fundamentals of psychology, philosophy, and mythology were included in the discussions, teachings, writings, and plays of this ancient civilization thousands of years ago.
